

Triage Approach on Serious Allegations

WHAT HAPPENS AT INTAKE?

- Every RFI Assigned to Intake Attorney
- Initial Decision Within Ten Days
- Approximately 90% of RFI's Resolved in Intake Division

- •Full-time Diversion Monitor
- -~500 Active Cases
- You name it, we monitor it

2013 NUMBERS

- In 2013, central intake handled 27,873 telephone calls. The intake division:
 - Reviewed 3,883 requests for investigation;
 - Entered into 42 diversion agreements;
 - Dismissed 113 cases with educational language; and,
 - Processed 366 cases for further investigation by the trial division.

RFI "PROCESSED" TO TRIAL DIVISION

About 10% of Total RFI's (350-400 per year)

DISMISSAL RECOMMENDATION TO REGULATION COUNSEL


Approximately 150 dismissals annually or about 30% of cases processed to Trial Division

(Abuse of Discretion By Regulation Counsel)


COLORADO SUPREME COURT ATTORNEY'S FUND FOR CLIENT PROTECTION

 Not a Malpractice Alternative


Colorado Supreme Court Attorney Regulation Counsel Central Intake - Types of Inquiries January 01, 2014 - June 23, 2014




